Remarks are limited to five (5) minutes per person. The City Clerk will be keeper of time and advise speaker when time has expired. Each member of the public will be permitted to speak only once per meeting. Criticism of public employees will be directed to the Human Resources Department during work hours only.

Mayor Troiano asked the Administrator looking into consolidating the office of Tax Assessor island-wide. He also said recent "Spout Offs" printed by the Herald Newspaper stated that the new Public Works building is costing taxpayers \$9 million. He said that's outrageous. He then had Public Works Director Chris D'Amico give a report on the actual costs. Mr. D'Amico said the real cost is about \$1.5 million, which includes some insurance money. He said the project's being done in-house. The Mayor asked that the newspaper be more responsible in the posting of such Spout Offs.

Len Lauriello – Said there's a dumpster in the backyard at 133 E. Hand Ave. that needs to be removed. He said it's like a transfer station the way it's being used. Code Enforcement Officer John Davis said he's aware of the problem, and that the dumpster will be gone in a few days. Mr. Lauriello said the property at 5009 Atlantic Ave. has been a long-time problem. He said it used to be four units, and now it's six. He said something needs to be done.

Katina Simmons, Hand Ave. – Said that property (5009 Atlantic) has sewer problems and is not supposed to be six units. Mr. Davis addressed the issue. He said there are major problems there. He said the City needs to stay strong when dealing with this property. Steve Booy, Zoning Officer, said there's no proof to show that the property is actually supposed to be four units. The Mayor said he would get the appropriate people down to the property for inspections.

Al Brannen, Bennett Ave. – Asked questions about Resolution G. Commissioner Leonetti explained. Mr. Brannen asked when the Fox Park playground would be completed. Mr. Oris said early spring.
