OPEN PUBLIC MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

As per N.J.S.A. 10:4-12, the City Clerk read the Open Public Meetings Act Announcement.

PRESENTATIONS:

•Wildwood Police Department & Wildwood Fire Department

Commissioner Mikulski states that on July 9, 2024, he received a phone call at 11:15pm from Chief Joseph Murphy involving a shooting in Wildwood. Due to the quick response from the Wildwood Police Department and Wildwood Fire Department, the victim, Vilte Gruzdyte is alive and well. Chief Murphy states Vilte is doing well and back home in Lithuania with her family. He recalls that night was a difficult night for all involved with police conducting many yard searches and the suspect was apprehended. Because of the exemplary work from both the police and fire departments, he received a letter and certificates from the Ambassador of Lithuania praising and giving thanks to both Fire and Police individuals. Fire Chief Ernest Troiano III states they were a block away when the call came in and did not hesitate to respond to save a life, even with the crime scene not yet being secured by police. Chief Troiano says Ms. Gruzdyte is doing great and he is proud of the exemplary men and fire individuals for their hard work and efforts. Chief Murphy, Chief Troiano, and Commissioner Mikulski present certificates of appreciation to both the Police and Fire Departments. Commissioner Mikulski says John Lynch played a key role for this presentation to take place. John Lynch states Vilte is a story of miracles. At the time, she was 20 years old and had only been in Wildwood for 1 week on a work visa when the tragic event took place. He notes the true miracle was Fire and Police stopping everything and coming together to get to Ms. Gruzdyte. He notes Ms. Gruzdyte walks well, her arm is paralyzed but improving and has difficulties with her speech but continues to improve daily. A GoFundMe was created to help aid the family where over \$100,000.00 was raised. Mr. Lynch speaks to Ms. Gruzdyte and her mother 2-3 times a week and notes they both are incredibly grateful and thankful to the Wildwood Police and Fire Departments and the entire community. Commissioner Mikulski says Chief Murphy is an asset to the community and praises him for his work and dedication to Wildwood. At this time the Board of Commissioners presents Chief Murphy with a Proclamation to thank him. Chief Murphy states he takes great pride in the men and women in the Police Department and is proud to lead them. He says it is an honor to be apart of this community and thanks the Board of Commissioners. The Police and Fire Departments pose for a photo to commemorate the moment with the Board of Commissioners.

REPORTS:

•Engineers Report – On file in the City Clerk's Office – In reference to the Bennett Avenue Street End Improvement Project, Marc DeBlasio says the concrete work is almost complete. DeBlasio & Associates have been working feverishly on the Capital Improvement Plan Phase 3- I-Bank and are on target to have plans and specs uploaded by mid-April. A pre-construction meeting was held March 11th for Phase 1, Contract 1 and the Lead Service Line Replacement Project will begin in June in Middle Township and will make its way to the island. Mr. DeBlasio presents the Board of Commissioners with a video presentation detailing the dune project. He states a drone was flown over the beach from Wildwood Crest side heading North. The video showed Wildwood in its current condition, overlayed with its potential future condition. Mayor Troiano states it is a

775ft Plunge and the DEP assured the City area "C" would not come into play but still remains in the plan. Mayor Troiano says the City needs the access road as it is used as the main transportation to the piers and events, noting the high tide will run into that area and does not want to push the high tide line close to that road.

Commissioner McConnell asks what is the purpose of the dune. Mayor Troiano previously suggested to the DEP to allow the City to build a wall to shield the front of the Boardwalk, however, the DEP said it would not be acceptable.

<u>Carl Schmoyer, 5201 Ocean Avenue:</u> Mr. Schmoyer says he attended the meeting in Wildwood Crest stating the DEP proposed to take half of the access road which he feels contradicts the original plan. Mr. Schmoyer is concerned for wildlife as he recalls there being 10ft of water at high tide in 1984. Mayor Troiano agrees the water would come up to the first original old section of the Boardwalk. Mr. Schmoyer states this will be a real detriment to the island. Mayor Troiano says the Board of Commissioners are not being greedy but are concerned and looking out for the people in this community.
