PRESENTATIONS:

- JIF Renewal Presentation Paul Miola presented the Board of Commissioners of an overview of the Joint Insurance Fund's functions including the programs available and ways to save money. He also explained how much money the City has saved by participating in wellness programs, web security training, changing certain procedures relative to the handling of the municipal vehicle fleet and much more. The Board expressed how pleased they are being a part of the JIF. They couldn't be happier with the services provided through the Fund and how helpful Casey, our local representative, is.
- Proclamation Copper Dog Mayor Byron and Commissioners presented a Proclamation to Mrs. Compare welcoming her and her family to the Wildwood business community. Mayor Byron and Commissioners are extremely grateful they invested in the City of Wildwood by opening the Copper Dog. The upgrades they made to the building are incredible and their food is amazing.
- Wall Murals Lloyd Boockoff (Amazing Lloyd's Art) Mr. Boockoff is in the beginning stages of starting his own business in painting wall murals. He provided the Board with some examples of his work and said he would really like to paint a mural on the wall directly under the Boardwalk between the areas of Rio Grande and Hand Avenues. The mural currently there is aged and fading. He would charge \$60.00 an hour. Commissioner Mikulski asked if he was insured. REPORTS:

•Engineers Report – On file in the City Clerk's Office. Commissioner Fitzsimons asked Mr. Chadwell how Tacony and Burk Avenue area held up over the past few days with all the rain we've had. Mr. Chadwell was not informed of anything however this area is predicted to experience some flooding on July 3rd so he will be there to observe the roadways. Commissioner Mikulski said North Wildwood did see some flooding during the rainstorm. Commissioner Mikulski and Mr. Chadwell have been working on traffic counts throughout Wildwood including reviewing crash data and anticipates presenting the Board roadway concepts at the end of July. Commissioner Fitzsimons asked Mr. Chadwell to explain "traffic counts" and expressed her concerns with the lane configuration on Park Boulevard and Cresse Avenues and the way the road shifts from two lanes to one so abruptly. Mr. Chadwell explained traffic counts include a study as to how many times vehicles turn down certain streets from every lane to determine the flow of traffic in an effort to determine traffic light timing configurations as well as crash data studies. Mr. Chadwell said the engineers are already looking at the area she is concerned about.

ANNOUNCEMENTS: Commissioner Mikulski announced there was a near drowning near the outfall pipe in Wildwood involving four people. He reminded the public to always swim near a lifeguard and never swim alone.

Commissioner Fitzsimons announced some upcoming events including but not limited to Sunday night concerts at Fox Park beginning July 2nd, Coffee with Krista happening on Saturday, Arts in the Parks on July 7th, which will occur twice a week for 6 weeks and the 2nd Annual Golf Cart Christmas Parade which will take place on the Boardwalk. The City has acquired the Woodland String Band to be a part of the event and urged everyone to participate.
